Letter From the President



Very few companies are in the business of trying to put themselves out of business, but HazingPrevention.Org (HPO) is one of them. And while progress has been made in eradicating this insidious hazing behavior from our lives, much work still needs to be done.

HPO transitioned from an almost purely volunteer base at its inception, to working with a professional association management group (ASG) who has taken the lead not only in the business end of things, but also in advocacy, promotion, and fundraising. We know that ASG cannot do it alone, so it is time for us to determine how to blend the support and expertise of our many talented anti-hazing

advocates, with those of our business leaders. We recognize the power of our supporters and volunteers. We also recognize that we need to provide ASG with additional resources so that they can grow our organization. It will take all of us working together to make the change happen.

Where do we start with our prevention efforts? Historically we have targeted college-aged students, and in many ways our fraternal communities. Many Greek organizations have soulsearched and supported the cause. But we now look to further expand our reach – into the high schools and into athletics, to name but a few. These may not be totally new areas, but we must branch out, start younger, and go broader. We also need to expand our concept on how to deliver hazing prevention skills, and bring prevention skills experts to our Board.

HPO's strategic plan continues to be reviewed, evaluated, and reviewed again. It will take the efforts of every one of us to change a culture built on abusive and oftentimes dangerous behaviors. We are steady in our resolve to end the abuse, but we need to work together to make it happen. Through efforts like our collaboration with AliveTek and our hazing prevention course, our increase in the use of social media, and the "These Hands Don't Haze" mosaic, metrics indicate awareness of the issues, and HPO's brand awareness, is very high. It is now time to get our prevention strategies to those same levels.

The Novak Institute remains a cornerstone of our prevention efforts, and we are excited by this year's hosting at Georgia Tech in Atlanta in June 2016. Our model is solid, but there are many evidence-based tactics that can work in tandem. We can take the lead in integrating those tactics and offering a comprehensive prevention plan.

We have the people in place who can lead the charge and make the difference. It is now up to all of us to make it happen.

So let's get to work.

Novak Institute for Hazing Prevention



Our 2015 Novak Institute for Hazing Prevention was held on the campus of the University of Memphis June 3-6, 2015. During our institute, nationally recognized faculty teach a prevention framework based on proven principles that are grounded in research. This fourday, interactive experience teaches diverse groups of interdisciplinary participants how to address hazing from a strategic approach that focuses on prevention rather than just response.

The Institute boasts an esteemed faculty list: Kim Novak, Dean; Linda Langford; Dan Wrona, Keith Ellis, Fred Dobry.

Since 2008, we have brought together dynamic groups of students and professionals and provided them the opportunity to cultivate the skills to develop and implement a comprehensive hazing prevention initiative. Additionally, we aim to instill hope that we have the capacity to prevent hazing. To this end, the Institute focuses on prevention of hazing as opposed to response.

The curriculum is based on a violence prevention framework designed by experts in public health, which includes (1) a set of proven principles and (2) a systematic and strategic planning process. The process

includes starting with a clear definition of the problem and its contributing factors (risk and protective factors), articulating what needs to change, looking at research about what works to make that change, creating effective programs and policies that carry out those change goals.

It's Everyone's Responsibility

AliveTek, Inc. and HazingPrevention.Org TM partnered in 2014 to launch a new online hazing-prevention course for the Florida SUS (State University System) in the fall of 2014, and roll out a customizable course for organizations and universities nationwide.

Hazing Prevention, It's Everyone's Responsibility™ is an evidencebased online course, reflecting best practices established by leading academics studying hazing. This one-hour awareness and prevention based course teaches students how to recognize, prevent and report hazing. The real-life scenarios prepare students, group members and bystanders to make informed decisions, ultimately empowering them to prevent hazing. Pre and post surveys are an important part of the program, and the aggregate data will be used to further efforts for prevention in the future.

AliveTek and HazingPrevention. Org are now offering this course to other colleges and universities, high schools, national organizations and sports teams around the country, with fully customizable branding, imagery and data reporting.

An extended Greek Life Module is available for those who would like a deeper dive into the issues facing fraternities and sororities.

A new Hazing Prevention 101 course is also available for individual purchase.




National Hazing Prevention Week - September 2015

6th Annual #40ANSWERS Campaign for National Hazing Prevention Week

In partnership with Sigma Nu Fraternity, HazingPrevention.Org held the 6th annual #40Answers Twitter campaign. For each of the 40 days leading up to National Hazing Prevention Week (September 21 – 25, 2015), one commonly heard excuse for hazing was posted via the Twitter accounts for HazingPrevention. OrgTM (@PreventHazing) and Sigma Nu Fraternity (@SigmaNuHQ).

Our 2015 #40Answers Twitter campaign using the hashtag saw 5,190 tweets with the hashtag reaching 12,089,051 impressions. Hundreds of participants, organizations and followers tweeted, retweeted and responded to the campaign. HPO now has almost 7,000 followers on Twitter.


Lianne Kowiak



Hazing Prevention Income: January 1 - December 31, 2015




